Formation Committee Support and Principles

CAISO Staff

CAISO staff is serving in a technical and advisory role, including providing subject matter experts on relevant topics such as CAISO's market structure, tariff and related agreements, technology platform, corporate governance structure, and/or an understanding of any legal requirements that may be relevant as the Launch Committee evaluates potential options. CAISO staff is not a member of the Launch Committee, and while providing technical support, it should not be interpreted as endorsing or otherwise taking any position on the proposals under consideration.

Principles

The Launch Committee/Formation Committee is not engaging in lobbying.

The Launch Committee and Formation Committee will not do anything that would interfere with the ongoing operations of the WEIM or the implementation of EDAM.



Legislative Update - SB 540

Authors -

 Senators Becker and Stern introduced SB 540 on February 20

Support -

 Co-Sponsors: Coalition of CA Utility Employees (CUE), State Association of Electrical Workers (IBEW), Environmental Defense Fund, Natural Resources Defense Council

SB 540

SB 450 authorizes California investor-owned utilities and the California Independent System Operator (CAISO) to participate in regional energy markets governed by an independent organization if certain conditions are met, including protections for the public interest and state policy autonomy.

These include:

- Public interest protections in the corporate documents;
- Specific roles and engagement with state regulators and consumer advocate offices including access to market data;
- Transparent and accessible operations including an office of public participation;
- Independent market analysis and monitoring;
- Engagement with states, local power authorities, and federal power marketing agencies to evaluate potential impacts of proposed market rule and tariff changes to state, local, and federal policies.
