Opportunity	Pros	Cons	Resources Needed
Data collection, compilation, and distribution	 History of model development Critical to WECC and stakeholder study efforts Centralized effort 	Certain efforts may not be directly in line with reliability objectives	Dependent on scope of work (0 to several new FTEs, power system modeling software, contracted services)
Support for longer- term transmission planning	Uses WECC's coordination and model development functions	Possible duplication of effortComplexity of uncertaintyLimited benefits	1 to 2 new FTEs
Interconnection-wide transmission trends assessment	Top-down assessment approachComplements existing processes	New approach to planning— process and information needs not yet known	Pilot in 2023Possibly 2 new FTEs
Training	Can be built on existing processes (e.g., model building)	 Competing with existing training programs Identification of specific interconnection-wide training needs 	1 new FTE

Enhanced Project Coordination processes	 Increases stakeholder engagement in Project Coordination Predefined process 	Possible duplication of effortVoluntary nature of existing process	1 FTE and engagement from RAC

Proposed WIRAB Advice



- Support WECC engaging in transmission planning activities in the West.
 - WECC has the expertise and a unique perspective that provides value
 - WECC should pursue Data Collection, Compilation, and Distribution and creating the Interconnection-Wide Transmission Trends Assessment.
 - WECC should <u>not</u> get involved in *Training* or *Engagement in State and Federal Approval Processes*.
- Recommend that WECC invest in skillsets and technology to adequately pursue these opportunities
